President's Corner

Spring has Sprung!

As we march into Spring, I hope that everyone is healthy and getting ready for Spring housecleaning and chores. Please exercise caution in cleaning up around the yard, especially if you end up on a ladder or the roof. Pay particular attention to outdoor fires and any cautions or limits that local officials may issue about burning. After a winter dry air and sunshine it is amazing how easily a fire can accidentally spread to nearby areas.

I hope you had a chance to participate in our recently held Meet the Candidate Forums in Northampton, Halifax, and Warren Counties. It is a great way to meet the folks looking to get your vote in a nonpartisan setting. The LGA conducts these forums as a service to the community, we do not endorse candidates or parties.

At the time of this writing, we are watching the spread of the Coronavirus disease (or COVID-19) and the efforts being taken to mitigate the growing threat it presents. Both the situation and response are fluid and sometimes changes daily. The LGA is tracking the recommendations of Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) as well as State and local Departments of Health as they may apply to our activities.

Our highest priority is the safety and wellbeing of our members and the community. We have postponed our Five County Forum until such time as the threat has subsided and will be evaluating our other activities as the situation evolves.

We must all do our part to minimize the spread of this disease. If all goes well, the spread will be checked and we will never know which of the protective measures succeeded. That will be a sacrifice worthwhile.

If you have lived or visited here more than a year, you probably know that Spring is also the time when we tend to get high run off into the Roanoke River. This brings the muddy water that is a natural part of the Spring cycle. It usually clears up as the weather warms up.

It is also when the Fish Spawning Season begins and runs through early June. During Fish Spawning Season, the flow rates out of Lake Gaston are specified for Dominion with much tighter limits than normal. In order to handle inflows from local rain events and maintain those tight flow specifications, Dominion is allowed to (and sometimes needs to) operate Lake Gaston at higher levels than normal.

Enjoy the Spring, be safe and be healthy.

Wally Sayko receives award from NCWRC

At the Lake Gaston Stakeholders Board meeting on February 27th, Wally Sayko was recognized and awarded the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission's Special Award of Excellence.

The award was presented by Mark Fowlkes, Piedmont Aquatic Habitat Coordinator and Corey Oakley, Piedmont Region Supervisor, Inland Fisheries.

Mr. Oakley stated, "Wally's hard work and dedication to managing vegetation on Lake Gaston has contributed significantly to its success. For years as the chair of the Lake Gaston Association's Lake Environment Committee, Wally recruited volunteers and participated in the whole lake submerged aquatic vegetation point intercept survey.

This data is used to help collaborate and refine NC State University's sonar based SAV survey data. Wally supported the 2014 agreement with the Commission, NC State University and the Lake Gaston Weed Control Council to expand the revegetation work within the lake and indicated the Lake Gaston Association could provide volunteers.

He was instrumental at rounding up volunteers and support from neighborhoods on the lake that allowed us to work in areas like Great Creek. Wally and LGA volunteers worked over 1,100 hours towards the revegetation project.

He was also responsible for working with the Lake Gaston Weed Control Council to purchase all the materials and supplies for the project, including almost 2.4 miles of fencing.

A revegetation project of this size is not possible without dedicated individuals like Wally Sayko and volunteers to make it happen. His insights, calm steadfast demeanor and concern for everyone's safety has contributed significantly to the project's success."

Wally was very thankful for receiving the recognition and thanked Pete Deschenes for his mentorship. Our hat is off to Wally for all his hard work as a LGA volunteer!

Projects galore for Lake Environment Committee

Shift from Flood Control to Fish Spawning Operations:

Rainfall in January led to flood control management at the reservoirs in the lower Roanoke River basin. For most of February John H. Kerr releases were in the 27-35,000 cfs range. At a minimum similar releases occur at Lake Gaston to maintain the 199.5'-200' above sea level elevation.

Fortunately we did not have a wet February and lake levels remained below 200'. These high flow rates have led to increases in turbidity. Fortunately we are now in fish spawn season and but for significant rain events releases have been in the 20-22,000 cfs range. Hopefully we will see water clarity improve over this spring.

Lake Environment Committee participates in Vegetation Control Planning:

LGA representatives participated in several recent meetings to finalize 2020 vegetation control plans on Lake Gaston. On February 3rd, the Technical Advisory Group (TAG) reviewed 2019 treatments, revegetation work, vegetation and tuber surveys, water quality data along and the Grass Carp stocking model to recommend 2020 treatments and revegetation of native species. On February 26th the State Aquatic Weed Control Council met to finalize the 2020 Weed Control Program.

Then on the 27th, the Lake Gaston Stakeholders Board led by Pete Deschences met to review the TAG recommendations and receive input from various stakeholder groups. Our president Don Carson participated as a voting board member. The Stakeholder's Board provided feedback to the Lake Gaston Weed Control Council (LGWCC) that evening where the TAG recommendations were presented by Jessica Bauman, Lake Manager, to the council.

A motion was made and approved by the LGWCC to accept these as the 2020 treatment plan. Several members of the Lake Environment Committee were actively engaged in this process throughout.

2019 Fall Vegetation Survey results:

The work that LGA volunteers do each fall is a significant component in developing treatment plans. It is critical to know what vegetation is present and where it is. This data, along with sonar surveys conducted by NCSU, are inputs to a program called "Bio Base" which generates heat maps showing the location and density of hydrilla.

Some highlights from the survey; over 60 volunteers contributed 550 hours conducting 6041 samples. 78% of sites had some vegetation present with water willow being the predominant vegetation found on 42% of sites, algae was found on 25% of all sites with Chara at 14% and Lyngbya at 11%.

Hydrilla acreage is estimated to be 160. This is on the low side of estimates made in the last 6 years being in the 150 to 400 acre range.

Thanks again to all the volunteers, too numerous to mention, who contributed to the fall survey effort. You are helping provide critical data in the vegetation management effort.

Highlights of the 2020 Lake Gaston Vegetation Management Plan:

- No additional Grass Carp to be stocked this year
- Treat 80 acres of Hydrilla beginning in June with an optional 80 acres for "flare ups", focus will be on Lizard and Pea Hill Creeks
- Move forward with treatments of Lyngbya using SePRO and Applied Biochemist products. Expand into operational treatments (20+ acres). Retain some current sites for long-term evaluation. Begin treatments in March. Explore lab research for new treatment technology
- Continue native revegetation and fall survey

Native Vegetation Work - Volunteers needed:

We continue to plan our work on the vegetation exclosures or cages. This is an annual effort to develop native vegetation replacing the hydrilla population we have so successfully reduced. We will survey the condition of the cages with NC Wildlife Resource Commission in late April.

Our focus this summer will be repairing existing cages and planting native vegetation inside and around cages. This work will take place the second week in June (Tuesday 9th –Thursday 11th), and is another great opportunity for volunteers to contribute to improving our lake environment. E. coli water testing:

E.coli water test equipment has been purchased and should be available for pick-up beginning at the April 1st Board meeting. We would like to see sediment levels drop and water temperatures rise before we begin testing (hopefully in May). Al Potter will continue to organize this effort for us.

Dominion to receive input on Shoreline Management Plan:

Consistent with its operating License with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commissions (FERC), Dominion Energy is receiving input on its Shoreline Management Plan for the Roanoke Rapids and Gaston Lakes. A meeting for the general public is being held at 09:30 am on Tuesday April 14th at the Roanoke Rapids Power Station, 100 Oakwood Ave., Roanoke Rapids, NC 27870. A meeting of Stakeholders only will take place that afternoon. Lake Gaston water level change -

Fish Spawning season March 1 thru June 15

Effective March 1 Dominion Energy is operating under fish spawning operations. This means that Lake Gaston can be raised an extra foot (199-201 feet) to provide storage in support of spawning flows as necessary. Dominion Energy has stated that they don't expect to raise the water level much more than a couple inches over 200 feet.

Nevertheless, experience has taught us to be prepared. We know that once we get above 200 feet we begin to encroach on many of our docks. You are reminded to make sure that any items that are on your docks are securely tied down including canoes and paddle boats. Items sitting on the floor of boat house sheds should be moved up to prevent the possibility of water damage. Boats in docks should be securely tied and boats in lifts should be raised and tied.

US Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 93 - 2020 training dates

April 18, May 9, June 6, July 18, August 22, Sept 26, Oct 17

America's Boating Safety Course is an eight hour course covering the basics of boating and is appropriate for youth as well as the adult boater. Successful completion of this course satisfies the education requirement for youth to operate a PWC in both Virginia and North Carolina.

Remember: <u>Virginia now has a law</u> that all boaters in the waters of Virginia will have proof of taking a Boating Course. All Motor Boat Operators operating a vessel with a 10 HP engine or greater, must meet these requirements. All PWC Operators regardless of age must have proof of taking a Boating Course.

North Carolina Law effective January 1, 2014 requires that all PWC and Motor Boat Operators who were born after 1 Jan 1988 will have proof of taking a Boating Course, if they are operating a vessel with a 10 HP engine or greater.

Clarification: Boaters on Lake Gaston need to be in compliance with their state of residence for Boater Education Certification. This is true whether the boater is a resident of North Carolina, Virginia, or any other state as recognized by both states' enforcement officers.

The fee for the course is \$30.00, **Preregistration and prepayment are required.** Courses are now taught at the Long Bridge VFD, 1678 Eaton Ferry Rd., Littleton, NC 27850. All classes are on Saturday from 8:30am to 5:00pm, with the exam given at the end of class.

Please bring your lunch. Bottled water and sodas can be purchased for 50 cents. It is a busy day - but rewarding. Remember – **Preregistration and Prepayment are required.**

Items to be shredded can include any old paper records; staples and paper clips need not be removed, but please no three ring binders or heavy metal clamps. We can accept any amounts that can be processed in the time period.

The truck mounted shredder consumes about 10 book boxes/cases of paper every 8 minutes. People can stand and watch while the paper is shredded. The shredding is professional grade and is the same level of shredding contracted by banking institutions.

NC Department of Public Safety recommends that families should develop and review an emergency plan and discuss thunderstorm and tornado safety with all members of your household. Make sure your family knows basic safety measures, such as first aid, CPR and how to use a fire extinguisher. Have a home evacuation plan and supplies for water, food, or fuel shortages. Have at least a weeks' extra prescription drugs in personal things that are ready to go with you to a safe place in a storm. National Safe Boating Week is May 16-22 and folks should check out their boating gear before beginning the fun for Memorial Day by checking fuel tanks for leaks, ventilation systems for obstructions (inboard/outboards and Personal Watercraft), anchors, ropes/tie lines, life vests, lights, horns, and batteries, and even trailer tires for proper pressure and brakes where applicable. Getting there is half the work. And getting the dock in shape is smart; trip hazards and cleats that can injure feet need to be removed from the dock area.

Daylight Savings Time is already here. Even so, take time to check that smoke alarms work and have good batteries. Some systems are on house wiring and will alarm when tested even if batteries are depleted. If there are bad batteries the sensor may not work at all. Also check all fire extinguishers to ensure they are charged and ready for use.

Employ surveillance cameras as a neighborhood or individually for property protection. Let local Sheriff Departments know the property will be unused for a time and most will perform random checks of entryways.

Just a reminder from the E 9-1-1 task force that there are still many issues contacting the correct 911 center when using cell phones. If available call using a landline. If using a cellular phone, when the call is answered give your location, including County and State. If you can't reach 911 by using your cell phone you can call the alternate number for the county you are in. Those numbers are in Virginia for Brunswick County - (434) 848-3133 and Mecklenburg - (434) 738-6191; and in NC for Halifax - (252) 583-7051, Northampton - (252) 574-1041, and Warren - (252) 257-3456. It is critical to know and provide an accurate location.

As I prepare this column while sipping an evening toddy on my deck, I heard the drone of a boat motor engine in the distance. Looking up I fully expected to see a fisherman but to my surprise I heard the "ker-plunk" of a water skier hitting the water. Wow, that has to be cold; even with a wet suit. Guess we can truly say it's time for water activities to commence, just 10 days before spring!

When you read this, the Lake Gaston Water Safety Council will have given our opening remarks to the attendees taking the first US Coast Guard Flotilla 93 Boating Safety Course of the season - this is a great learning opportunity. This information should be mandatory for first time boaters and the information presented may save your life or that of someone else enjoying our lake.

Since we communicated last, we introduced NC political candidates to the community. We had 30 candidates to participate in our Meet the Candidates Forums for Northampton, Halifax and Warren Counties in North Carolina. The forums were attended by local residents looking to meet the candidates and hear views on many topics. Congratulations to all candidates who participated in the primary process.

The Government Relations Committee carefully considered the current situation with the Coronavirus and whether we should go forward with our annual Five County Forum workshop scheduled for March 19. We agreed that everyone's safety and well-being is a priority. Therefore, we decided to postpone this workshop and hopefully we can schedule for later in the year as we hope that the situation and conditions have improved. We will be back in touch with a new date as soon as feasible.

The Government Relations committee is preparing budget letters for each of the five counties. The letters are for each county government and request specific funds to support weed management efforts that should be included in the upcoming FY 2020-2021 budget process. We asked each county to fund \$116K to help control noxious aquatic vegetation and maintain water quality. These letters are read by an LGA director in the comment period at a Commissioner/ Supervisor meeting prior to the adoption of next year's budgets.
