2020 Fall Vegetation Survey results

Over 60 LGA volunteers participated this past fall to survey the entire 350 miles of Lake Gaston shoreline. This was a tremendous effort and "hats off" to all those who participated.

Approximately 6,000 sample points were taken. Jessica Baumann, Extension Associate for Lake Gaston with NC State University's Aquatic Plant Management Program has analyzed this data and results from their biosonics work to generate a report which will become available early March.

Water willow continues to be the greatest component of emergent vegetation. A small population of Hydrilla is still located throughout the lake, but sites in very shallow water, small and patchy. Lyngbya continues to be a concern with some areas showing expansion.

These results and other research are shared with the Technical Advisory Group or TAG and the Stakeholders Group. The TAG will be making recommendations for integrated management such as Grass Carp stocking, revegetation with natives, and Aquatic Herbicide treatments to the Lake Gaston Weed Control Council (LGWCC).

Members of the LGA Lake Environment Committee have been active participants in this management process and our LGA volunteers are recognized!

Thanks again to all, too numerous to mention, who contributed to this effort. You are helping keep our lake environment healthy!

Jessica Baumann's Aquatic Management Update this April 7th

The Lake Gaston Extension Associate, Jessica Baumann, will provide the LGA an update on Aquatic Management at our April 7th Board Meeting via ZOOM. This is always an informative presentation and provides our members an opportunity to hear the latest on how our volunteer efforts contribute to overall health of Lake Gaston.

Other Lake Committee Activities

Plans are underway to continue providing LGA volunteers with E.coli water test equipment. Over 100 test kits were distributed in 2020.

We participated with the NC Wildlife Commission in conducting a survey of the vegetation exclosures or cages for plant growth and needed upkeep last fall. Several cages are in need of repair. We will develop plans to do this work later this summer. This is another great opportunity for volunteers to contribute to improving our lake environment.

Tough and challenging times

I felt really good on January 2 that I could lower my boat into the water and enjoy a cruise on my pontoon boat. I have a former work colleague who lives in London. The pandemic restricts folks in the UK who can't even visit boat yards. At least we still have that option.

If you are still boating on Lake Gaston, enjoy the opportunity and savor what it's like to be in the USA. It's great to be living at Lake Gaston.

Having said that, the water temperature is in the 40's. Now is not the time to have an unplanned fall into the lake as I did a couple of months ago.

This from Sea Tow: – Did you know that your chances of dying from going overboard are five times greater in winter months than in the summer? The Sea Tow Foundation – a national nonprofit organization dedicated to the education and awareness of safe boating practices – is reminding boaters of the importance of boating safely in cold weather.

This safety information is especially important for hunters, paddlers and all other recreational boaters in areas where the water and/or air temperature is colder during the winter months.

One of the most pertinent cold weather requirements is to wear a life jacket. This is in response to the abnormally high number of accidents and deaths that have occurred as a result of cold water immersion. A human's body temperature drops 25 times faster when immersed in cold water (water that is 50 degrees or cooler), ultimately affecting internal organs and leading to hypothermia.

Children and older persons are most vulnerable to hypothermia. A total of five northern states have laws that require life jackets be worn by boaters during cold weather months, but water and air temperatures can become cold even in southern states.

"Many people don't realize the dangers that can come from boating during colder months," said Gail R. Kulp, Sea Tow Foundation's executive director. "Even the best swimmer would have difficulty if immersed in cold water due to the effects it has on our bodies. The Sea Tow Foundation is committed to boating safety and encourages all boaters and passengers to wear a life jacket, especially during the colder months. Life jackets save lives, but only if they are worn."

Please be careful out there.

Be Prepared! A message from the Public Safety Committee

Congratulations to a growing number of full time residents and part timers that have invested into their Property Owner Associations and personal property and have had alarm systems and cameras installed at their properties which may have something to do with fewer recent burglaries. More subdivisions have installed cameras in strategic locations around their entryways which also helps to send the message to would be thieves that some other location may be easier. There are many actions which contribute to lowering crime but the least costly is taking precautionary action.

The winter season is starting to turn towards more seriously cold and inclement weather. So far this winter season we have been able to observe the bad storms on television from elsewhere in the country. But the icy, snowy weather is still likely to hit home soon and there is the potential for high wind and wet weather which also can cause damage and injuries. Get ready early this week by getting the salt for deicing before the storm occurs, secure loose items on decks and docks, and put an extra case of water in the garage.

One of the safety issues for the elderly and those with pre-existing conditions this season is the continuing threat of COVID-19 infection. Thankfully the NC Governor has prioritized those in the 75 + age group. In NC call your County Health Department and get on the recipient list to receive the vaccine at your earliest possible time. The vaccine is well tested and there have been no proven issues with widespread reactions. Protect yourself and your family.

In March with return of Daylight Savings Time, take the time to check/replace batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. It could save your life and property. If you do not have one or cannot install or check the ones you do have, contact your local firefighters; they would rather help you before you need them in an emergency.

There are new scams created constantly, and you must stay alert and wary of things that sound true at first blush. There is a problem with your Social Security or Medicare or email security or credit card is the way most of the scams work. Never respond to the calls or email or tests with an action that could compromise your privacy and security. You should maintain contact information that you have personal knowledge is accurate. If there is a question use trusted contact information to assure there is no issue with your accounts.

Where permitted by your bank or other financial institutions, health care, and other highly sensitive data systems, use an ID that is not your email account. Upgrade your passwords to at least 12-14 characters (including numbers, uppercase, and special symbols) and don't use as passwords items that could be easily identified in social media. Use a separate/different password for each of your key accounts to prevent someone from getting a common password and email and using them to invade your bank and other personal accounts. You can manage these passwords in Windows or other third party password managers. Set up a two-factor system for key accounts like banks, where you put in your User ID and 14+ character password and then the bank or other systems sends to your phone a text message with a six-digit number at random as a challenge code to verify your ID.

From the Desk of the Executive Director

What a year 2020 turned out to be for me ... on January 29th I fell and broke by right arm in two places. My first ever experience in breaking a bone let alone breaking two bones at the same time. Just before my right arm meets the start of my hand, I had clean breaks of the Ulna and the Radius. Luck was with me that I didn't need surgery.

I left the hospital with a cast to keep my two bones in line until I saw the doctor the next morning. As the bones were in line, I was fitted with a removable cast that would keep the two bones from moving. I could take the cast off for showering but had to put it back on soonest. I asked if I could still type with my right hand (my dominant hand) but I was immediately told "absolutely not" that could cause the two bones to shift.

The worst was yet to come ... I was not allowed to drive until the two bones had healed. "What?," I said. I was very lucky that I had friends and neighbors that offered to take me to the weekly doctor visits and supermarkets. It was April 9th when I was let loose – my two broken bones were mended and I could drive my car again, and use my right hand to write with.

However, my right hand fingers needed attention because the joints looked like pyramid peaks. I started going to physical therapy as well as doing my hand therapy at home. I was told it could be a good year before they would straighten out. I play the piano and it took a while to get the pinky finger on my right hand to flex enough to reach an octave. I play often and my right hand is doing well.

I'm still doing 16 exercises with my right hand early in the morning before breakfast, and repeat those exercises in the evening every day. My goal is to have those knuckles flat so I can put on my favorite ring on my fourth finger - it will only get to the start of the knuckle at this time.

Last year after the fall I learned to type with my left hand and it also covered for the right hand fingers as well. I learned to write with the left hand too, didn't look too bad either, if I do say so myself.

I was able to keep my LGA work going. My busiest time of the year is always getting the renewal notices together in September and having C-Line Graphics print and mail them. We had 2,003 members who were paid thru 2020. Reminders, 270, were mailed the second week of January. Thank you so much for everybody who renewed for 2021 and beyond.

One of my favorite projects is helping John 3:16 with their annual Toy Drive - the project comes under the LGA's Marketing & Membership Committee. We had nine LGA business members having a toy box at their location. Periodically we would check the boxes and take the overflow to John 3:16. Besides toys in the boxes there were clothes & shoes too. The John 3:16 Center was able to distribute Christmas gifts for more than 232 children, their most yet.

As for COVID-19, unfortunately it is still with us. As you will have read in Don's article in the President's Corner we will be doing more Zoom meetings for both our monthly first Wednesday of the month Board meetings, and our Committee meetings. We have a speaker lined up for Wednesday, February 3rd, Leanne Patrick, CEO/President, Lake Gaston Regional Chamber of Commerce. See advertisement on page 2.

America's Boating Course is an eight-hour course covering the basics of boating and is appropriate for youth as well as the adult boater. Successful completion of this course satisfies the education requirement to operate a boat in ANY STATE and for youth to operate a PWC in both Virginia and North Carolina.

Virginia Law: All Virginia boaters in the waters must have proof of taking a Boating Course.

North Carolina Law: Requires that all PWC and Motor Boat Operators born after 1 Jan 1988 will have proof of completing a Boating Course, if they are operating a vessel with a 10 HP engine or greater.

For questions/comments related to lake levels and operations, please send an email to lakeinfo@dominionenergy.com. A couple of items related to the account ...

- 1. As would be expected, this is not to be used for emergencies.
- 2. The account will be checked at least weekly and emails will be forwarded to the proper person for reply.
- 3. For questions related to Shoreline Management such as docks, riprap or the mileage buoys, please continue to call Will Miller, the Reservoir Program Manager, at 252-535-6894
- 4. For issues related to boating safety and regulations:

In North Carolina, WRC enforcement officers are the point of contact. If there is an urgent concern about safety or violations, please call the enforcement hotline at 800-662-7137 and the dispatch center will contact the nearest officer General complaints should probably be directed to Col. Jon Evans at 919-707-0036.

In Virginia, VA Conservation Police Officers (CPO's) enforce boating safety laws. Violations in progress should be reported to the Wildlife Crime Line at 1-800-237-5712 or WildCrime@dgif.virginia.gov .

Mile marker buoys & danger buoys

If you notice a mile marker buoy that is damaged, light is out, is missing from its mooring, has washed up on the shore, etc., please contact Dominion Energy at (252) 535-6161 Ext. 4. Similarly, if you notice a danger or no wake buoy damaged, missing, etc. please contact the LGA at info@lakegastonassoc.com or (252) 586-6577 or 1-888-586-6577 and we will report it to the NC Wildlife Resource Commission or VA Department of Game and Inland Fisheries.

Buoys placed in Lake Gaston need state & federal approval

Dominion Energy as well as the Virginia Department of Game & Inland Fisheries and North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission have received complaints concerning buoys being placed in the lake to deter boats near boat docks.

Both Virginia Department of Game & Inland Fisheries and North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission, as well as Dominion, do not allow buoys to be placed in the lake without state and federal approval. Any buoys placed in the lake will be considered an obstruction to navigation and will be required to be removed.


RULES FOR PASSING AND OVERTAKING OTHER VESSELS
