### President's Corner

It is with great sadness that we note the passing of Jack Saunders on February 8, 2021. Jack was a pillar of the Lake Gaston community, contributing his talents and time to many organizations in the Lake Gaston area. For the LGA, he was an invaluable member of our team, not only as a member of the LGA Board of Directors, he was our Treasurer, and chair of our Public Safety Committee.

More importantly, Jack was a close and dear friend. Jack's spirit of friendliness, caring, and community giving will live on through his influence on all of us. We are all thankful for the opportunity to have worked with and alongside him. We truly will miss him, but will never forget him.

We are again holding our popular Community Paper Shredding event, on May 8, from 10 am to 1 p.m. (see details on page 5). This was one of Jack's favorite Public Safety Committee projects and we have decided to rename it the Jack D. Saunders Community Shred.

LGA COVID update – It is great to see the COVID vaccine being distributed to more and more people. We continue to track the recommendations of Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) as well as State and local Departments of Health as they may apply to our activities.

Our highest priority is the safety and wellbeing of our members and the community. We have postponed our Five County Forum until such time as the threat has subsided and will be evaluating our other activities as the situation evolves. We are definitely looking forward to meeting our friends and neighbors in person as soon as safely possible.

Corey Chamberlain, from Dominion Energy, provided an update of Lake Gaston status from their perspective at the March monthly BoD meeting. One item of note is that, so far this year, the Lake has received an average of 22,080 cubic feet per second (cfs) of water which is more that 2½ times the average inflow of 8,316 cfs. Last year we averaged 15,220 cfs, which is almost twice the average inflow. All this is to point out that it has been an unusually wet couple of years for the Roanoke River basin, which explains why we've seen so much high water. With these high inflows comes the muddy water that is a natural part of the Spring cycle. It usually clears up as the weather warms up.

Fish Spawning Season begins in March and runs through mid-June. During Fish Spawning Season, the flow rates out of Lake Gaston are specified by the Corps of Engineers for Dominion with much tighter limits than normal. In order to handle inflows from local rain events and still maintain those tight flow specifications, Dominion is allowed to (and sometimes needs to) operate Lake Gaston at higher levels than normal. Enjoy the Spring, be safe and be healthy.

I am writing this as the new Chair for the LGA Public Safety Committee. It seems inappropriate and downright unfair to carry on without acknowledging Jack Saunders' years of service as the Chair of the LGA Public Safety Committee.

I first met Jack in the fall of 2015 when I attended my first committee meeting. After 8 years as a police officer and then over 30+ years in Corporate Security at numerous multinational corporations, this committee seemed to be a good fit and closely aligned to my work experience. Jack was a good mentor and we seemed to hit it off. I learned Jack had a wealth of life experiences which he conveyed in words and action to committee. He also wrote some darn good Safety articles.

It took Jack's passing to see another side of Jack; things he never discussed just to get him street cred. Jack never sought the limelight. I knew Jack retired after 20 years of service from the Air Force. What I didn't know he retired as a Lieutenant Colonel. He then spent almost 15 years at Hughes Aircraft and then Raytheon Company retiring as an assistant General Manager.

Jack had the unique ability to break things down into bite size pieces of actionable information. I also noted he was relentless in pursuing an idea or correct a wrong. Jack doggedly chased over several years NCDOT and the USCG about the need for nighttime navigation lights under the Eaton Ferry Bridge. Thanks to Jack's work behind the scenes, we will soon see navigational lights under the Eaton Ferry Bridge; something that should have been in place when the bridge was built.

The above is just one example. Jack brought the annual shred event to the lake. It's grown bigger each year. Jack could always be found, rain or shine, at the LGA Annual meeting in front of the grill cooking the hot dogs. No job was too big or too small for Jack.

We will miss Jack and the lake dearly will miss Jack. It is now our job to carry his street sense of doing what is right forward in time. To borrow a Navy phrase, Rest Well Jack, we have the watch.

### LGA participates in Stakeholders Winter Meeting

In February stakeholders met to hear the latest Technical Advisory Group's (TAG) recommendations on Lyngbya management. This group is chaired by Pete Deschenes with the able assistance of Susie Deschenes. While several LGA members attended, Don Carson represented LGA as a voting member.

Jessica Bauman, NC State Extension Associate, highlighted the fall survey results stating that the acreage of Lyngbya continues to increase and is now at approximately 1200 acres. The TAG recommended increasing algaecide treatments up to 300 acres (91 acres in 2020). The stakeholders agreed with these recommendations and this was shared with the Lake Gaston Weed Control Council.

Kirk Rundle, Biologist with the NC Wildlife Resources Commission (the Commission), answered questions regarding Alabama Bass. He stated that a 2018 survey indicates that up to a third of all spotted bass in Lake Gaston could possibly be Alabama Bass. They are an aggressive species that out compete Largemouth Bass and readily hybridizes with Smallmouth and Spotted Bass.

#### Lake Gaston Weed Control Council (LGWCC) Plans for 2021

The LGWCC recently met to approve treatment plans based on TAG and Stakeholders recommendations. Jessica provided details on 2020 treatments, research and survey results. Bids from Chemical Vendors and Applicators were reviewed and approved. With the Hydrilla population being well under control, treatments will be for "flare ups" only.

For Lyngbya treatments it was agreed to contract with Aqua Services, Inc. of Guntersville, based on their experience and innovative equipment. The plan is to treat multiple sites six times with approximately thirty days between Algaecide applications. Treatments will begin as soon as water temperatures allow (late March-early April). More details on dates and location will be communicated to the public.

Mark Fowlkes, Piedmont Aquatic Habitat Coordinator with the Commission, reported particularly good results of the vegetation exclosures in several locations, particularly Stonehouse Creek. He discussed what a new 5-year Vegetation Establishment plan would involve. Mark will be working with Jessica to determine how we can incorporate fish attractors with ell grass in the future. This will require Dominion approval. Mark thanked all the volunteers who have been instrumental in building the exclosures or "cages", and planting native vegetation over the past 5 years.

#### E. coli water testing

E.coli water test equipment has been purchased and should be available for pick-up beginning mid-April. We would like to see sediment levels drop and water temperatures rise before we begin testing (hopefully in May). Al Potter will continue to organize this effort for us. An email will be sent out with details on how to get the equipment.

#### Plan now for summer "Cage" and Native Vegetation Work - Volunteers needed

We continue to plan our work on the vegetation exclosures or cages. This is an annual effort to develop native vegetation replacing the hydrilla population we have so successfully reduced. We will survey the condition of the cages with NC Wildlife Resource Commission in late April.

Our focus this summer will be repairing existing cages and planting native vegetation inside and around cages. This work will take place the second week in June (Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> –Thursday 17<sup>th</sup>), and is another great opportunity for volunteers to contribute to improving our lake environment.

### LGA's Jack D. Saunders Community Shred Event

The Lake Gaston Association will sponsor its Seventh Annual Community Paper Shred on Saturday, May 8<sup>th</sup> from 10 a.m. until 1 p.m. The collection will be accomplished in the lower parking area at the Roanoke-Wildwood Volunteer Fire Department at 790 Lizard Creek Rd. The service is free to the public but contributions will be gratefully accepted.

Items to be shredded can include any old paper records; staples and paper clips need not be removed, but please no three ring binders or heavy metal clamps. We can accept any amounts of paper for shredding that can be processed in the time period.

The truck mounted shredder consumes about 10 book boxes/cases of paper every 8 minutes. No boxes can go in the shredder, no computer memory discs or thumb drives can go in the shredder. People can stand and watch while the paper is shredded. The shredding is professional grade and is the same level of shredding contracted by banking institutions. ### Lake Gaston water level change -Fish Spawning season March 1 thru June 15

Effective March 1 Dominion Energy is operating under fish spawning operations. This means that Lake Gaston can be raised an extra foot (199-201 feet) to provide storage in support of spawning flows as necessary. Dominion Energy has stated that they don't expect to raise the water level much more than a couple inches over 200 feet.

Nevertheless, experience has taught us to be prepared. We know that once we get above 200 feet we begin to encroach on many of our docks. You are reminded to make sure that any items that are on your docks are securely tied down including canoes and paddle boats. Items sitting on the floor of boat house sheds should be moved up to prevent the possibility of water damage. Boats in docks should be securely tied and boats in lifts should be raised and tied.

### Buoys placed in Lake Gaston need state & federal approval

Dominion Energy as well as the Virginia Department of Game & Inland Fisheries and North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission have received complaints concerning buoys being placed in the lake to deter boats near boat docks.

Both Virginia Department of Game & Inland Fisheries and North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission, as well as Dominion, do not allow buoys to be placed in the lake without state and federal approval. Any buoys placed in the lake will be considered an obstruction to navigation and will be required to be removed.


### Mile marker buoys & danger buoys

For questions/comments related to lake levels and operations, please send an email to lakeinfo@dominionenergy.com . A couple of items related to the account ...

- 1. As would be expected, this is not to be used for emergencies.
- 2. The account will be checked at least weekly and emails will be forwarded to the proper person for reply.
- 3. For questions related to Shoreline Management such as docks, riprap or the mileage buoys, please continue to call Will Miller, the Reservoir Program Manager, at 252-535-6894
- 4. For issues related to boating safety and regulations:

In **North Carolina**, WRC enforcement officers are the point of contact. If there is an urgent concern about safety or violations, please call the enforcement hotline at 800-662-7137 and the dispatch center will contact the nearest officer on duty. General complaints should probably be directed to Col. Jon Evans at 919-707-0036.


