President's Corner...



Why should I join or stay on as an LGA Member? The cost of membership isn't very high, but \$25 bucks is \$25.00, or as I type this, about five gallons of gas. Do you feel you are getting your money's worth by being a member? Let's see if there is a measurable value to your membership.

Why do we live, play, and vacation here? For the lake of course. What would happen to property values if the lake somehow became polluted and you couldn't fish or swim in it? What if the kids would get a rash from the water? It wasn't that many years ago when Hydrilla, a nasty invasive plant species, was a big issue! The LGA and various local and regional partners were in the middle of getting this fixed and it's no longer an issue. Yet, once again we are busy addressing the Lyngbya nuisance problem on our lake.

Our lake water quality is so good Virginia Beach and nearby counties use this lake as a source of drinking water. We also know when we get an unintentional mouthful of lake water, we can swallow it without fear of ingesting chemicals.

How about Taxes? If you are like me, my primary residence is elsewhere so I can't vote in local elections. What would you do if taxes went up exorbitantly? As a non-voter, you would sit by helplessly. Did you know this was the very reason the predecessor organization of the LGA was formed? As said on our masthead, we are the voice of our membership. We aren't miracle workers, and we know we can't please everyone. However, we do our best to keep open lines of communication between county governments and the LGA. I guess you should ask yourself if you are better off with the LGA in place or not.

How about safety and security-related issues? Even full-timers can't be at their house 24/7. The Public Safety Committee stays in touch with local law enforcement. Come to our September monthly meeting to hear all 5 county sheriff's departments tell us what's going on around the lake and in the communities. The LGA offers the Annual Jack D. Saunders Community Shred Event at no cost. The LGA pays for this out of membership dues. The event last May was the best attended ever but it's costing more each year to get the shred truck here from Raleigh.

What Exactly is the Dominion Energy Partnership? We stay in close communication with Dominion to discuss issues of interest to our members, and they contact us (and we let our members know) if they anticipate conditions requiring raised water levels.

The LGA has the horsepower to pull off Candidate Forums and the Annual 5 County Forum for County Managers and Elected Officials. We also invite NC and VA Wildlife Officers to our meeting once a year to get the scoop on what's happening at the lake. You also get to ask questions. The LGA brings in subject matter experts to talk about the logging trucks on our roads, solar residential use, local development both in Littleton and Warrenton, and what's happening at the soon-to-beopened Lakeland Cultural Arts Center, and we even sponsor the annual Lake Clean-Up Day.

I could go on and on – So why am I telling you all this? We have a little over 1,900 households and 100 businesses that care enough to pay for a membership. With 7,000 + homes at the lake, there are a lot of folks who are indifferent or maybe don't know about the LGA. We are trying to reach those who are not aware of the LGA and what we do. People will spend money if they perceive value and dread the alternative. Please help us grow the membership as the dues directly support all our activities throughout the year.

In this issue, you will hear more about what we are doing to show value and why the LGA is important to the lake. Just think of the programs we could fund/support if we had 5,000 households who were willing to make the \$25 annual investment or \$250.00 for a lifetime membership.

I can assure you the LGA Board will continue to be good stewards of your dues and continue to support vital programs and initiatives that benefit the lake and all our residents.

Public Safety Committee News...

Summer is in full swing!

As we enjoy the lake, please continue to be mindful of staying safe on the water and at home. Don't forget to look out for the other guy when boating and please be mindful of your wake when near other boats, swimmers, structures, and the shoreline. We have a hard and fast rule at the house; the young grandkids don't even set foot down at the boathouse without a life jacket.

The Public Safety Committee voted to financially support two Kids Camps that were organized by the Warren County Fireman's Association and the Roanoke Wildwood Volunteer Fire Department. Both camps were very successful. The camps provided our youth with their first exposure to the fire service and promoted good social skills and teamwork. We also supported a one-day training program for volunteer first responders who serve their respective communities in Brunswick and Mecklenburg.



This is the time of the year that we start seeing the hurricane and hazardous storms pick up in occurrence. To ensure that members have timely, location-specific hazardous weather information, please make use of the emergency information from the counties around the lake by signing up for notifications at:

The information available from the county emergency services offices is local to the county and areas of the affected county. It is also potentially the timeliest source of information tied to a specific address. For instance, the counties all receive up-to-date, accurate weather information from the National Weather Service and the state governments. Dominion Power has the county's emergency services offices in its notification tree.

The Lake Gaston Association will still provide high water warnings and other critical information, but our communication is not as timely as that available through these official emergency services sources.

How do I report an Aquatic Plant issue?

Members of the Lake Environment Committee are frequently asked what is this lake weed, and what can be done about it.

Water Willow - the most common shoreline vegetation at LKG.



The first step is to identify the species of plant or algae, to determine if and how it can be managed. This link takes you to a reporting form that helps identify what aquatic plant is at issue. https://forms.gle/HDETJHXqjLKuArj66. We ask that you complete the form which allows for tracking and consideration in any future management plans conducted by the Lake Gaston Weed Control Council.

Please note the most common native of emergent vegetation along the Lake Gaston shoreline is Water Willow. Removing Water Willow is a violation of Dominion's Shoreline Management Plan. Operating under license with "FERC" – (the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission).

Weed Control Council Algaecide Treatments

The Lake Gaston Weed Control Council (LGWCC) continues to fund algaecide treatments based upon recommendations from a Technical Advisory Group with support from the Lake Gaston Stakeholders Group. The applicator is Aqua Services, Inc. of Guntersville, AL.


Four treatments for Lyngbya have already been conducted (through July). Plans are for an additional treatment August 16-19th, with another the week of September 13-16th. Maps showing the specific treatment areas can be found at: http://www.lgwcc.org

E. coli Testing

The Committee is using Coliscan Easy gel water test kits to check for E. coli various tributaries on the lake. This is a simple, accurate, and quantitative way to identify and differentiate coliforms and E. coli (true fecal coliform). The presence of fecal coliform bacteria indicates contamination by human and/or animal fecal material. If E. coli is present in water, disease-causing bacteria may also be present.

If you become aware of a potential E. coli issue and would like to run a test, contact a committee member, or email us at: Environment@LakeGastonAssoc.com. We ask that you provide your test results so we can track results by location over time.

Fall Vegetation Survey Plans



Planning is now underway for the 2022 fall volunteer vegetation survey.

This is the single most important way for volunteers to contribute to invasive plant control and vegetation management. There are primarily a handful of species found throughout the Lake Gaston shoreline, so it's fairly easy to learn what these are. A physical "toss" of a two-sided rake pulled in with a rope, and visual identification is then made. Data is then logged into a tablet. A series of sample points are taken as you travel the shoreline in a boat, kayak, or your favorite means of water locomotion! This works great with teams of two or three, but an

early morning solo kayak trip is my favorite.

We will once again be using remote training with a video developed by NCSU and an electronic sign-up form. We will be making these available to our members in mid-August.

We hope you can take time this fall (September – October) to help with this important project.

Have you ever wanted to give back to your community but don't see yourself as a professional volunteer firefighter / professional rescue squad volunteer being called out at all hours of the day or night, or attending weekly/monthly meetings of well-trained and committed first responders? Then we have a new way for you to give back with minimal impact on your life and advance notification when your service will be needed!

Warren County EMS is starting the CERT Program in September. What is CERT you ask? It is the Warren County Community Emergency Response Team. An all-volunteer organization trained and managed under the Warren County Emergency Services Department.

Disasters can be both small and large, and impact large areas/cities or even a small part of the local population, assistance is needed to allow highly trained emergency service workers to perform their duties. That's where the CERT Team comes into the picture. Volunteers are trained in how to prepare for these instances and provide consistent approaches to those in need.

Warren County EMS will provide CERT training services, CPR classes, and ongoing annual training in emergency management, outreach, and community involvement programs. All training will be conducted at the EMS facility on Hwy 158 Bypass in Warren County. Requirements are to be a citizen living in Warren County, at least 18 years of age, complete the training, and maintain good moral character, plus adhere to Warren County Emergency management beliefs and ethics.

Similarly, if you notice a danger or no wake buoy damaged, missing, etc., please contact the LGA at (252) 586-6577 or via email at ExecDir@LakeGastonAssoc.com and we will report it to the NC Wildlife Resource Commission or VA Department of Game and Inland Fisheries.



Buoys placed in Lake Gaston need both State & Federal Approval

Dominion Energy, as well as the VA Department of Game & Inland Fisheries and the NC Wildlife Resources Commission, have received complaints concerning buoys being placed in the lake to deter boats near boat docks.

Both the VA Department of Game & Inland Fisheries and the NC Wildlife Resources Commission, as well as Dominion Energy, do not allow buoys to be placed in the lake without State & Federal approval. Any buoys placed in the lake will be considered an obstruction to navigation and will be required to be removed.

LGA Recipe Roundup...

French Onion Baked Chicken

French Onion Soup is one of the classics of French cuisine and comfort food. French Onion Baked Chicken takes the sweet, mellow, cheesy favors of the soup and transforms it into a rich, decadent sauce for juicy chicken. Deeply savory and with notes of molasses and herb, French Onion Baked Chicken has a slow-cooked sumptuous taste but takes an hour or less to make. It's the comfort food other comfort foods dream about.



1/3 cup parmesan cheese, shredded

Ingredients	2/3 cup reduced-sodium beef broth	
3 tablespoons butter	4 chicken breasts, boneless and skinless	
2 teaspoons olive oil	1/2 teaspoon kosher salt	
4 large yellow onions, peeled and sliced	1/2 teaspoon black pepper	
1/4 teaspoon black pepper	1/2 teaspoon dried thyme	
2 sprigs of fresh thyme	1 teaspoon garlic powder	
3 cloves garlic, minced	1 cup mozzarella cheese, shredded	

Directions

1 tablespoon balsamic vinegar

- 1. Heat a large skillet over medium to medium-high heat.
- 2. Add the butter, olive oil, and sliced onions. Season with black pepper.
- 3. Add the thyme sprigs and cook for 8 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- 4. While the onions are cooking, preheat the oven to 400 degrees F.
- 5. Butter a 9x13-inch baking dish. Set aside.
- 6. After 8 minutes, reduce the heat on the pan of onions down to medium or medium-low, and cook them for another 15 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- 7. Stir in the garlic and cook for 1 minute.
- 8. Stir in the balsamic vinegar and 1/3 cup of the beef broth.
- 9. Stir and cook for another minute or so, until the onion mixture is thick with a jam-like consistency.
- 10. Add about a 1/2 cup of the caramelized onions to the prepared baking dish
- 11. Add the remaining 1/3 cup beef broth to the baking dish and stir.
- 12. Season the chicken breasts on both sides with kosher salt, black pepper, dried thyme, and garlic powder.
- 13. Arrange the chicken in the prepared baking dish and top each breast with a generous spoonful of the caramelized onions.
- 14. Top the chicken and onions with mozzarella and parmesan cheese.
- 15. Bake until the chicken is cooked to an internal temperature of 165 degrees F, about 25 minutes.

Annual 2022 Lake Gaston Vegetation Survey

Volunteers Needed!!

September 1st through October 31st, volunteers are needed to document aquatic vegetation, both good and bad! The shoreline is 350 miles and all needs sampling. This survey is an important tool that determines how to keep Lake Gaston healthy for swimming, boating and fishing.

To volunteer:

- Access to a boat, kayak, or jet ski and a few hours to spend on the lake
- The shoreline is divided into survey sections, volunteers can choose sites close to home.
- Equipment to be provided:
 - a. Handheld electronic tablet for data collection
 - b. Rake
 - Plant ID booklet that will cover most of the plants you will encounter at Lake Gaston
 - d. Training is provided by several on-line videos that will explain the vegetation survey in detail & provide tips of aquatic plant identification
